Andrew Bowyer's

Baptismal Statement

I've wanted to be baptized for a while now, since the end of 2014 - December 24, 2014, to be exact, the day my mother passed away. In an instant my life was changed completely and I didn't know what to do with myself. I was feeling a little shell-shocked, not really knowing how to respond. I mean, what do you do when someone tells you that a huge part of your life has just been ripped away? So my family and I decided to come to the Christmas Eve service night. Immediately, I was surrounded by people who were there to support me. The first person to come up to me was none other than Lin herself. She hugged both Maggie and me and told us that we were loved. That moment began to reshape for me what it means to be "Christian" and a follower of Jesus.

I have come to believe that following Jesus is about not being overcome by loss, but about letting it make you stronger, and also realizing that it's okay if you can't always be strong. It is about knowing that you have family who can support you and being that family for others. On that night after my mother's death - on the day I lost one of the most significant parts of my own family - I also discovered that I have family here in a way I hadn't before understood.

Moving forward, the youth group has continued to be a huge source of support I am honored to have Lin baptizing me - and to have Elijah, a good friend from youth reading my statement - and to have Jared Webb, one of our SS teachers as a mentor in faith. In youth, we practice weekly this idea of family - of living together. This is the place where vulnerable Christian community becomes most real for me.

Why? For a week out of each year, we live together, serve together, study and worship together. We get annoyed with each other and bite each other's heads off and then find ourselves in need of forgiveness. When we have questions about faith, this is where we ask them. When we are struggling to overcome our lack of self-confidence, this is the place we begin to find courage first. When we need to get over ourselves, these are the people who love us enough to tell us. This is the place we share our deepest regrets and our most profound joys. I am grateful for these people and I look forward to youth group as the highlight of my week. I know that I can count on these friends and our amazing youth sponsors if I ever need anything. Well, anything within reason.

This church also remains a constant source of love and support. This church is more than just the place I come to worship, it's my second home. I am a teenage boy trying to figure out myself and the world - I struggle with anger and inattention, though I have been working on them forever.

I am afraid to think of where I would be without College Park.

But that is why it is so important for me to be baptized - because I believe in the transformative power of God's

love to always be making me more who God wants me to be - through this community, through prayer, through my own personal relationship with Jesus. I don't have it all together - I will likely struggle my whole life to feel like I ever "have it all together" - but this is the gospel as I understand it. God's love is bigger than all that. God's love envelops me in the family of God here in this place and calls me into more significant relationship with God and the people around me.

I feel that following Jesus isn't just about going to church or praying the right things - instead, I believe following Jesus is about following him with my actions, which for me includes going to church and praying. It also includes caring for my friends, owning my mistakes, helping Rydell with the slides in Tessera, showing up to

move furniture for people in the congregation, or going out of my way to be helpful at home. Following Jesus is about living your life without worrying about other people's perception of you, but instead giving your focus to the relationship between us. It's about finding the grace to be yourself instead of constantly trying to change for others. It's not about trying to make sure everything is perfect and stuff doesn't hit the fan - but it's about knowing that when it does that I am loved and not alone and I'm part of a community that will help me clean it up.

Ultimately, I think following Jesus comes down to this - these two great commandments - to love God with passion; and to love ourselves and others without condition.

Living in this community has taught me a lot about this and I'm grateful for the family I have found here.


Returning Peace Corp Volunteers (PCVs)
