

A Few Things to Remember when Caring for People with Cancer ...

This congregation has seen more than its fair share of people we love fighting cancer and we have created a remarkable support system for these families. As you continue to minister with us to these families, here are some important things to remember:

- We often want to offer our support but aren't exactly sure how to do that. Our staff, caregiving committee and our casserole committee stay connected to these families to find out what they are needing and when that would be most helpful. Consider offering your support by being connected to one of these groups.
- Offer love by making people feel seen. It's okay to ask how things are going when you see people who you know are going through treatment. A note of love is also a welcomed gift.
- Take care with what you share. We all have our own experiences with cancer that stir emotions and stories not always helpful for those currently walking this difficult journey.
- Remember the children. Families are often taking these experiences one step at a time, especially when children are involved. Be careful not to move ahead or say too much little ears and hearts take in more than we realize.


This summer our youth will spend a week living with and serving alongside the community of New Orleans. The dates for the trip are July 18—25. Cost is \$400.


